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Who is the SPCB?

- Certifying Board for the Certified Specialty Pharmacist (CSP) credential created in 2012.
- Established to offer a non-governmental professional certification program for pharmacists.
- Responsible for overseeing the development of the credential, policies and procedures for the credential, and to oversee the development of the certification examination.
- Dedicated to promoting the highest possible quality standards



Mission, Purpose and Scope

- The mission of the SPCB is to provide independent, verifiable evidence of proficiency in specialty pharmacy through a nationally recognized, accredited, and rigorous certification program.
- The purpose of the Certified Specialty Pharmacist (CSP) credential is to recognize individuals who have demonstrated intermediate knowledge and skill to provide competent specialty pharmacy services.
- The scope of the SPCB is to oversee the certification program, develop and implement policies and procedures for the certification, and oversee the development of the examination.





Relationship with NASP

- The National Association of Specialty Pharmacy (NASP) is a 501(c)(6) non-profit trade association representing all stakeholders in the specialty pharmacy industry.
- In 2016, the SPCB became an unincorporated division of NASP.
- The NASP Board of Directors has delegated to the SPCB sole authority and autonomy with respect to all certification

Board Composition

Certified Directors

- 9-14 Specialty Pharmacists
- Hold the CSP Credential

Public Member

 Represents patients who are consumers of pharmaceutical products.

Stakeholders

- 4-5 Positions
- Employee of a stakeholder or who has related stakeholder interests in any area of the specialty pharmacy industry.



Roles & Responsibilities

- Confidentiality
- Define, expand and/or reduce the scope of the certification program, including development of additional certifications and/or specialty credentials.
- Establish policies and procedures for granting certification, including eligibility requirements.
- Establish policies and procedures for maintaining certification, including recertification requirements.
- Establish policies and procedures for suspending or withdrawing certification, including oversight for all disciplinary investigations and actions related to certificants.
- Provide fiscal oversight for the organization.
- Develop, maintain, administer, and score the certification examination(s) in a manner consistent with generally accepted psychometric practices to ensure that the examination is reasonably valid and reliable.
- Establish and enforce an ethical code for individuals holding the credential(s).
- Provide oversight of qualified personnel.
- Provide oversight to any committee(s) as needed (nominating, item development, etc.)
- advance ethical practice and to advocate for professional development to ensure patients receive safe, efficient care now and in the future.

Overview of Certification

What is Certification?

- Process by which individuals demonstrate required knowledge and skill.
- Meet predetermined, standardized criteria.
- Tool for identifying competent individuals.
- Usually voluntary, non-governmental (vs. licensure).
- Time-limited
- Independent of a specific class, course, or other education or training program.
- Primary focus on the examination.
- advance ethical practice and to advocate for professional development to ensure patients receive safe, efficient care now and in the future.



Value of Certification

- A high-quality certification validates an individual's knowledge, skills, and abilities in a defined profession, occupation, skill, or role.
- Reduces and enhances consumer protection and public safety.
- Shows employers and other stakeholders individuals who have the competencies needed to perform a role or task.



Benefits of Certification

Certificate Holders

- •Increased recognition by peers and respect of colleagues
- •Greater confidence in their professional competence
- Opportunity for employment and advancement
- •Increased professional trust from employers or the public
- Increased autonomy in the workplace
- Better compensation and career longevity

Consumers

- •Objective, independent, third-party evaluation and assessment of professional competence
- •Commitment to public safety and/or consumer protection
- •Accountability through ethical conduct standards and/or a disciplinary process
- •Recertification requirements for continued or enhanced competence

Employers

- •Qualified individuals for employment or advancement
- •Recertification requirements for continued or enhanced competence
- •Commitment to public safety and/or consumer protection
- •Reduced risk of errors, accidents and/or legal liability
- •Reduced employee turnover and increased job satisfaction
- Justification for potential compensation differential



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What is Accreditation?

- An objective third-party.
- Recognition granted to a certification program by a nongovernmental agency.
- Verification that a certification program has met predetermined standards.
- Time-limited
- Voluntary
- policies, procedures, and decisions.

Fundamentals of Accreditation










Test Development Steps





Content Domains






Disease States

- Immunoglobulin & Enzyme Deficiencies (3%)





 Throughout the Exam
- Computer-Based Examination with a Two (2)
 Hour Time Limit
- Offered in English Only
- Administered Year-Round in Six (6) Testing Windows
- Administered On-Site at PSI Testing Centers
 Nationwide and in Canada
- Results Available Immediately



CSP Eligibility


- Education: BS Pharm or PharmD
- Licensure: Active pharmacist license in good standing, with no current restrictions or pending actions in the United States or Canada.
- Background: No previous history of felony convictions.
- Continuing Education: Completion of thirty (30) hours of ACPE approved specialty pharmacy continuing education in the previous two (2) years.
- Experience: 3,000 hours of Specialty Pharmacy practice in previous four (4) years.
- Background, Code of Conduct, and Application Accuracy Attestation
- Passing Score on CSP Exam


